

Patient Right's Charter

• Access to Care

Patients have the right to receive timely and appropriate care, including emergency care and access to healthcare facilities.

Informed Consent

Patients have the right to understand the risks and benefits of their treatment options and to make informed decisions about their care.

• Confidentiality

Patients have the right to privacy and confidentiality regarding their medical information.

• Right to Refuse Treatment

Patients have the right to refuse treatment, even if it means potentially risking their health, provided they can make informed decisions.

• Second Opinion

Patients have the right to seek a second opinion from another healthcare professional.

• Continuity of Care

Patients have the right to ongoing, coordinated care that addresses their needs.

• Respect and Dignity

Patients have the right to be treated with respect and dignity by healthcare professionals.

• Safe Environment

Patients have the right to a clean, safe, and comfortable environment for their care.

• Knowledge of their Health

Patients have the right to receive information about their health condition, treatment options, and prognosis.

• Participation in Decision-Making

Patients have the right to be involved in decisions about their care.

• Right to Complain

Patients have the right to file complaints about their care and have them addressed fairly.
